

ADVOCACY HIGHLIGHTS



We partnered with our grantee partners to influence 11 local and state policies, positively impacting women, girls, and their families.



Because of supporters LIKE YOU...

The Women's Foundation was able to help our grantee partners:

EARLY CARE & EDUCATION

- **Professional Development:** Hold 28 in-person and virtual events, including professional development sessions, young children's performances, and early educator networking opportunities, increasing engagement by 20%.
- Policy & Advocacy Expansion: Expand the child care subsidy program to families earning up to 300% of the federal poverty level, demonstrating its significance in building a racially-just early education system and inclusive economy.
- **Professional Development:** Support early educators in applying for the Fall 2023 bilingual AA program at the University of DC Community College. Recently, 21 educators completed the inaugural class and 20 more graduated in May.
- Policy & Advocacy Engagement: Engage 50 educators & 20 parents and guardians and train over 500 people in the art of storytelling in an effort to help 150 educators, parents, and community leaders craft and deliver their stories in critical forums like oversight hearings and public conferences.

ROCK STAR FUND

• Equipping Youth Entrepreneurs: Invest in participatory grantmaking to provide young women and gender-expansive youth of color ages 12–24 living in DC with a grant of up to \$2,000 to invest in their own community-change project. Your investment allowed us to award grants to 8 young women, each coming up with innovative projects that advance the recommendations of our <u>Blueprint for Action</u>.

SAFETY & VIOLENCE PREVENTION

- **Team Expansion:** Hire additional staff, including attorneys, a healing justice program manager, outreach personnel, survivor services team members and other critical staff to significantly boost organizational capacity.
- **Critical Housing Support:** Provide housing referrals to regional partners and emergency housing to those with urgent needs.
- Healing Justice Program Expansion: Respond to the growing need for a healing justice program to enhance youth support and hire a youth attorney.
- Immigrant Survivors Support: Deliver comprehensive services, including legal representation, housing referrals, victim advocacy, and food and clothing access to over 800 immigrant survivors.
- Enhanced Outreach: Expand communication efforts through various channels leading to the grantee partner's highest number of referrals in its organization's 19-year history, reaching more survivors in need.

YOUNG WOMEN'S INITIATIVE

- **Empowering Youth:** Organize a dynamic summit that gathered more than 120 youth across DC to collaboratively address and brainstorm relevant and pressing youth challenges.
- Healing Justice Circle Nurturing: Host healing circles that benefitted more than 25 youth participants and included self-care toolkits, yoga techniques, and effective breathing practices to empower youth to manage stress and anxiety effectively.
- Influential Political Forums: Orchestrate a Mayoral Candidate forum and a General Councilmember candidate forum ahead of the primaries for 17 candidates, fostering essential conversations on issues critical to youth.
